# Senate Bill (SB) 1 Grant Program

- In 2021, Governor Newsom signed SB 1 into law. SB 1 directs the state to provide funding to local and regional governments to develop sea level rise (SLR) adaptation plans and implementation projects.
- In 2022 and 2023, The Ocean Protection Council (OPC) received \$37.5 to support the implementation of SB 1 through the SB 1 Grant Program. As of June 2025, \$14.14 million is available for funding SB 1 projects.
- The goal of the SB 1 Grant Program is to support the implementation of SB 1 by funding SLR adaptation planning and projects along the entire geographic coast of all of California and San Francisco Bay.

### Tribal vs. Track 1 Funding: Key Differences

Tribal Track	Track 1			
All CA Native American Tribes: federally recognized and non-federally recognized (via non-profit partner)	Restricted to federally-recognized tribes			
Supports tribally-specific SLR pre-planning and planning, and tribal consultation in land use plans	Must lead to development of a land use plan			
Flexibility in how to assess SLR impacts on tribal resources, including use of Traditional Knowledge	Proposals must align with specific technical criteria, including SB 1 SLR Criteria			
\$5,000,000 available through dedicated funding source, anticipated project range: \$250,000-\$750,000	At least 5% of remaining \$19.97M available for proposals co-developed between tribes and local governments			





## SB 1 Eligibility

#### **OPEN**

#### Track 1: SLR Adaptation Planning

- Applicants that are eligible to apply:
  - Local governments (including Special Districts)
  - Regional governments

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- Federally recognized tribal governments
- Organizations or consultants who apply on a government's behalf



#### **OPEN**

#### Tribal Cultural Resources Funding Track

- Applicants that are eligible to apply:
  - All California Native American tribes
  - Federally recognized tribes
  - Non-federally recognized tribes (with a nonprofit partner)

#### NOT YET OPEN

#### Track 2: SLR Implementation Projects

- Applicants that are eligible to apply:
  - o Local governments (including Special Districts)
  - Regional governments
  - CA Native American tribes (federally recognized and nonfederally recognized)
  - State Agencies
  - Public or Private Universities
  - o Nonprofit Organizations, including CBOs, NGOs, and private entities

## **SB 1 Grant Program Funding**

**\$200,000 - \$1,500,000** 

#### Maximum Project Timeline

2 years

#### **Proposal Review**

 Proposals are accepted through a rolling, quarterly, non-competitive process

#### **OPEN**

#### **Tribal Cultural Resources Funding Track**

#### **Funding Range**

**\$250,000-\$750,000** 

#### Maximum Project Timeline

2 years

#### **Proposal Review**

 Proposals are accepted through a rolling, quarterly, noncompetitive process

#### **NOT YET OPEN**

#### **Track 2: SLR Implementation Projects**

#### Funding Range

**\$500,000-\$2,500,000** 

#### Maximum Project Timeline

3 years

#### **Proposal Review**

 Proposals are accepted through a competitive process starting in late 2025

The complementary SB 1 Technical Assistance (TA) Program provides application assistance to local, regional, and tribal governments that represent priority communities applying for SLR adaptation planning funding through the SB 1 Grant Program

## SB 1 TA Application Process

#### **On-line Questionnaire**

- Applicant completes on-line questionnaire for TA Program
- (7-15 minutes)
- Not sure if you qualify? Apply anyway!

#### **Intake Call**

 TA Team conducts intake call, assesses eligibility using priority criteria, and assigns TA level and TA provider

#### **Technical Assistance**

TA Provider helps TA recipient complete their proposal
