NEW SAN FRANCISCO BAY PLAN AMENDMENTS

Fill for Habitat

Amended the San Francisco Bay Plan fill policies to address adaption to rising seas.

- Sea level rise and climate change as a driver
- Recognizes potential benefits of fill
- Allows greater amounts of fill for habitat
- Focuses on habitat solutions
- Provides for fill protections

Social Equity and Environmental Justice

Amended the San Francisco Bay Plan to address environmental justice and social equity.

Many vulnerable communities along the shoreline have the least resources to be resilient to rising sea level




